Yue Jing 樂經 – The Book of Music

Yue Jing 樂經 - Book of Music (or Classic of Music), also known simply as Yue 樂 (music), is one of the Liujing (Six Classics) of the pre-Qin era (770-221 BCE). This text on music was considered as important as the Li Jing 禮經 (Classic of Rites), being regarded as the primary source of ancient Chinese musical thinking. However, there is no extant book, either because it is lost (perhaps in the Great Burning of Books in 213 BCE) or because its ideas are contained in the Shi Jing 詩經 (Book of Poetry) and the Li Ji 禮記 (Book of Rites).
